



Once-off funding to honour memory of dedicated arts worker

Carclew Youth Arts is offering two young, regionally based people, interested in pursuing their passion and interest in the arts, to apply for once-off funding. The funds have been made available to honour the memory of Anya Machczynski, a former Arts Officer with Country Arts SA.

Young people aged 26 and under with a passion for a chosen art form are eligible and are encouraged to apply for the two allocations, valued at \$310 each.

Tricia Walton, Carclew Chief Executive, said she was "honoured Carclew was nominated to distribute the funds to aspiring young artists".

"To see the funds go to regional young people is very fitting for Anya's memory as she worked hard to bring artistic opportunities to regional communities," Tricia added.

The funds are eligible to be used in a variety of ways, so long as it supports the development of an artistic interest or passion. This may be to purchase art materials, attend a professional performance or event, including festivals, or to pay for professional tuition fees.

To apply, applicants must answer the three following criteria in 200 words or less:

1. Who you are and a description of the art you make or love
2. Who or what inspires you
3. Outline how you would spend \$310 to feed your artistic passion
