The newly created position of Senior Project Officer will work closely with the Aboriginal Arts Development Manager, Lee-Ann Buckskin in the delivery of two core outreach projects; Remote Communities Leadership and Mentoring Program, and the Tjitjiku Inma Project.

The role will be located at Carclew in North Adelaide but requires travel to remote Indigenous communities.

Suitable applicants will boast strong project management and leadership skills and experience; good knowledge and experience in preparing grants, funding submissions, budgets and acquittals; and a proven commitment and passion for working with children and young people.

Importantly experience in working with diverse communities, in particular Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people is required.
