Sharehouse - 2023 Carclew Residency Program Outline

Aim: To provide early-career artists with the time, space and support to explore and develop their creative practice over a 12-month period as Residents at Carclew.

The Residency

The **2023 Residents** will be provided with a studio space at Carclew, 11 Jeffcott Street, North Adelaide that is most suitable to their artistic needs as outlined in their application. Primarily an opportunity for early-career artists/practitioners to experiment with their creative practice and hone their craft. Residents will also be supported by Carclew staff to develop their professional capacities more broadly. 2023 Residents will also contribute work to the annual South Australian Living Artists Festival (SALA) exhibition curated by the 2023 Carclew Curator in Residence in Carclew's Ballroom and/or Foyer Gallery.

The Studio Spaces

The studio spaces available for Sharehouse 2023 residencies include:

- Messy Spaces: two exclusive-use Stables Studios, accessible between 7am and 12am, 7 days a week. These studios are ideal for messy artforms, such as painting, sculpture.
- Big Space: The Carclew Ballroom, a large, shared space accessible for 20 hours per week within business hours and until 12am outside of business hours.
- Digital Space: The Carclew digital suite, with hot desks and digital equipment for film, sound, photography and other forms of digital art. Shared space accessible for 20 hours per week within business hours and until 12am outside of business hours.

Expectations

The 2023 Residents will:

- Be aged between 18 – 26 years and currently living in South Australia
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander applicants up to 30 years
- Be available to in February 2023 as negotiated with Carclew staff
- Enter a formal contract agreement with Carclew for the period of the residency
- Attain at their own cost, a DCSI Working with Children Clearance
- Use the space provided regularly and consistently throughout the period of the residency
- Supply all materials used throughout the residency
- Create or provide work to be featured in the annual SALA exhibition in the Carclew Ballroom and/or Foyer Gallery as part of SALA in August 2023
- Meet regularly with Carclew staff, provide written and verbal updates and feedback regarding the progress of their residency
- Contribute content to Carclew's website and social media presence
- Participate in artist presentations and/or open studio events during Carclew functions, subject to availability and with reasonable notice
- Volunteer to gallery sit and support associated events when and where possible

Benefits

Carclew can negotiate a range of benefits including:

- Free access to a studio space
- Free access to GigCity wireless internet, meeting rooms and office space (via Carclew's booking system)
- Promotion and mentorship support directly from Carclew's Arts Programs, Funding and Marketing teams
- Access to Carclew staff training and professional development
- Featured in the 2023 SALA Festival

Selection Criteria

Candidates for Sharehouse - 2023 Residency Program will be shortlisted using the following selection criteria:

- Quality of past work and artistic merit of proposed residency activity
- Suitability of applicant's practice/plans to studio spaces
- Potential of applicant to fulfil the residency expectations
- Impact of residency on applicant's development of new skills, abilities and networks
- Timeliness of this opportunity in relation to applicant's career and skill development
- Willingness to engage with Carclew, arts sector and wider community

Selection Process

A selection committee of Carclew staff and independent practitioners will assess all applications received by the deadline. Applicants will be notified of the outcome by mid-November 2022.

Following shortlisting, candidates will be invited to an informal interview that will give applicants the opportunity to 'show and tell' their practice.

Application details

Applications are to include the following (use this as a checklist)

- Completed Cover Sheet or JotForm
- Artist/Professional Statement (max. 1 page)
Consider the following questions as prompts for your statement:
 - Why do you want to participate in the Residency?
 - What activities do you intend to undertake as part of the Residency?
 - Where do you see yourself in your career right now?
 - How do you see the Residency benefiting the development of your career?
 - What do you believe you can contribute to Carclew, the arts sector and wider community through the Residency?
 - What studio space are you applying for and why?
- Creative CV
- Biography
- Support documentation (as appropriate to your previous experience)
Documentation can include:
 - Images/documents of previous and/or current work in progress (max. 10 images, low-resolution/max 10 documents)
 - Links to video or audio documentation (max. 5 links to online content)



Application Deadline

Applications must be received by **11:59pm ACST Friday 28 October 2022**.
