DICTATORSHIP OF GRAVITY (AND OTHER MICRO-POLITICS)



With new works by Carclew's Artists in Residence, visual artist Felicity Townsend and painter Loren Orsillo, **Dictatorship** of Gravity (and other micro-politics) delves into the fundamental interconnectedness of sub-atomic forces through to mundane specimens of material culture, examining the micro-conditions that collectively govern our lived realities.

Investigating compliance and rebellion against rules, conventions and forces that construct our reality, **Dictatorship of Gravity (and other micro-politics)** intends to push boundaries both real and imagined. Both Loren and Felicity are emerging South Australian artists whose practices cross artistic boundaries.

Townsend, whose repertoire comprises a broad cross section of sculpture, installation and performance art, is intrigued by points of intersection and interconnectedness, whether across disciplines, identities or personal interactions.

With paintings that cross boundaries into sculpture and installation, Orsillo tackles and represents the inequivalent and disjointed meanings placed on objects of small-scale and daily encounters.

Carclew's Residency Program enables two young artists to develop and explore their practices, as well as the freedom and space to create new bodies of work. The program offers two fully subsidised artist studio spaces, extending the opportunity for artists to reside in a space where they can develop their artform, gain industry support and access opportunities to expand their professional networks.
