Blak Seeds Fest: The Ultimate First Nations Music, Arts & Culture Celebration You Can't Miss!

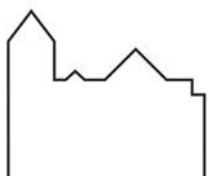


Image is of Back Yard Picnic by Samuel Graves

Blak Seeds Fest also features an exciting market space with talented First Nations artist, including Wurtarti Creations, Maali Yorga Arts, Nay's Art, Bea Lewis, and Debbie Brown - a perfect opportunity to purchase and support local talent.

Guests can explore original paintings, contemporary and traditional artworks, including beautifully embellished skateboards, from emerging and established First Nations visual artists such as Tanaya Antony, Debbie Brown, Keith Gilbey-Warrior, Jasmine Kerdel, Melanie Koolmatrie, Bea Lewis, and Bedlam Rigney in the Ballroom and Foyer Galleries. The exhibition is open now for an extended viewing period until March 6, Monday to Friday, 9 am -5 pm.

Attendees can indulge in a plentiful selection of food and beverages, with stalls offering Australian native cuisine from Meez On Plus, fresh brewed coffee from Frothy Fella and refreshing drinks at Kombi Crew, serving First Nations owned beverages Munda wines, Gangurru Seltzers, and beers thanks to Indibrew.

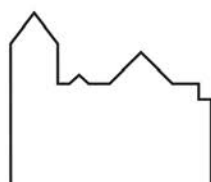
