They are independent arts professionals who review applications and provide advice based on published criteria.

FAQs

Who can be a peer assessor?

Artists, arts workers and cultural leaders with relevant professional experience.

Do peer assessors make funding decisions?

No. Peer assessors provide advice. Final decisions are made by the organisation.

How long is a peer assessor appointed for?

Appointments are for a fixed two-year term.

How are conflicts of interest managed?

All assessors must declare conflicts and step away from any applications where a conflict exists.

Is the role paid?

Yes. Peer assessors are paid for their time and expertise.

How are assessors supported?

Assessors receive an induction and are supported by staff throughout the process.

Why use peer assessment?

Peer assessment brings sector knowledge, lived experience and diverse perspectives into funding decisions.
